Know all Men by these Presents that I John Jamison of Ballystroan in the Parrish of Dunboe in the County of Londonderry and Kingdom of Ireland Farmer for Given??? good causes & Considerations me hereunto moveing, have nominated constituted & appointed and by these Presents do make ordain constituted & appoint and in my place and Stead put Robert Parkison of Bavagh in the County of Londonderry my True and lawfull Attorney; for me and in my Name to apply to John Murphey and James Rogers or either of them if Executors of the Last Will and Testament in Writing of John Jamison late of Londonderry in New England in America, Cordwainer deceased or to any other person or persons Executors of the Said last Will and Testament of the Said John Jamison deceased or to any and all other persons and persons whom it Doth or may concern for an account of all and Singular the Real & personal Estate which the Said John Jamison died possessed of or Intitled unto; and by all Lawful ways and means Whatsoever to make a Discovery thereof and also to ask demand & require, From the Said Executors or any other person or persons whom it doth or may concern all or Such part or Parts of the Estate Real or personal of the Said John Jamison, Deceased as he by his said last Will and Testament bequeathed to me and upon refusal or Neglect of the Said Executors or any person or persons whom it may Concern to give and deliver up to my Said Attorney all or Such part of the Testators Real or personal Estate as was bequeathed to me to commence and prosecute to final Judgment Execution, or Decree any action or actions Suite or Suites wither in Law or Equity for Recovery thereof and upon Such Recovery or Freely receiving the Same to take and Except thereof and of the Estate Real of the Said Testator bequeathed to me to Receive and take possession and ---??--- for his own use, and behoof and to no other use Trust Intent or Purpose Whatsoever and of Such parts of the personal of the Said Testator as were bequeathed to me if any Such bequest there was to Receive also for my Sole and only use and upon Rect of the Same acquittance, Discharges or other Release or Releases in my Name to make and give and grant to my Said attorney full power and authority to put my Name and affix my Seal to Such Release or Releases And generally to Do and Perform all other and Further Lawful act and acts thing and things Whatsoever which may be, Requisite and Necessary for the purposes aforesaid And I hereby Ratify and Confirm all and whatsoever my Said Attorney Shall Lawfully do or Cause to be Done in and Concerning the Premises either by him self or his lawful substitute, or substitutes whom I hereby Improve him for that purpose to make and Revoke at Pleasure as Fully and effectually to all Intents and purposes as if I had been personally present and transacted the Same.
